

## **Damaged battery?**

Identify batteries that are swollen, corroded, leaking, or have burn marks. Defective and recalled batteries require special handling.



## What kind of battery is it?

How you handle a damaged battery depends on the type. But no matter the type, always handle damaged batteries with care and wear personal protective gear.

Damaged alkaline, nickel cadmium, lead acid, and nickel metal batteries can be individually sealed in a plastic bag and placed into an E360S recycling container.

Damaged lithium or lithium ion batteries must be separated from other battery types and shipped in accordance with the Transporation of Dangerous Goods Act. Carefully place these batteries individually in a sealed plastic bag and deposit them into an E360S DDR Battery Recycling Container or UN rated container packed with vermiculite or fire suppression material.
